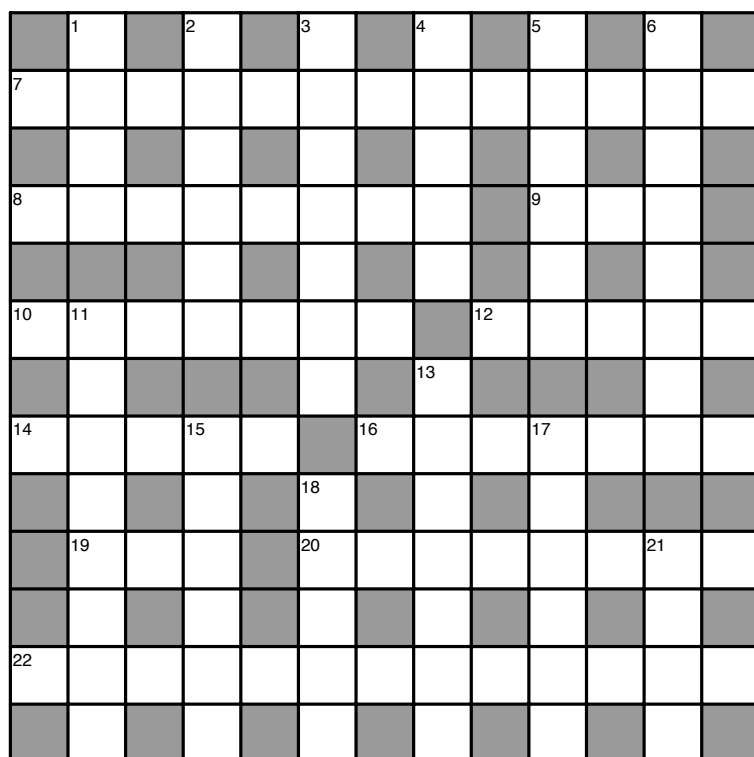


Sophos summer crossword fun: filling in time
